

We are in Unama'ki, one of the seven traditional and unceded ancestral territories of the people of Mi'kma'ki. This territory is covered by the Treaties of Peace and Friendship which the Mi'kmaq first signed with the British Crown in 1726.

We wish to recognize and honour this understanding of the lands on which we reside. It is from here, on these lands, that we work to create and support a culture of self-reliance and vibrancy.


Supportive Housing for Individuals with Mental Illness (SHIMI) is an innovative solution to a pressing community need for individuals who are living with mental illness and in need of supportive housing options.

The project provides high quality, secure, affordable, and independent housing together with a range of responsive supports to adults living with, and recovering from, a mental illness.

New Dawn owns and operates 28 SHIMI apartments and fellow community organization, Pathways to Employment, owns and operates 12 SHIMI apartments. Intake and supportive services are provided by the Nova Scotia Office of Mental Health and Addictions.

Pine Tree Park is an 80-acre community on the outskirts of Sydney, Cape Breton and is home to the Pine Tree Care Home and Home Living, Schooner Curling Club, and affordable rental homes, duplexes, and quadplexes.

New Dawn, with support from the provincial and federal government and the Verschuren Centre for Sustainability in Energy and the Environment has upgraded the buildings and homes on the property to improve their building envelopes and efficiency and decrease their energy consumption, and installed a 700kWh 1800-panel solar array that will provide all of the energy consumed by the community.

In 2023, New Dawn opened Abbey Ridge, a supportive housing project for youth aged 16 to 21. Located in Glace Bay, Abbey Ridge provides safe, affordable housing and wraparound support services for eight young people who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, or aging out of the foster care system.

The goal of Abbey Ridge is to guide youth towards successful and healthy independent living in the future. Youth in the Abbey Ridge Supportive Living program are at high risk of negative life outcomes due to a lack of resources, support, and stability.

The program aims to help youth overcome these barriers by assisting them in reaching personal goals through support, empowerment, and advocacy.

In partnership with the Ally Centre of Cape Breton, New Dawn is constructing 25 new units of housing for some of our most vulnerable community members. This affordable and supportive housing project will open in late 2024 and provide a home for more than two dozen new tenants who are currently homeless, at imminent risk of homelessness, and living with addiction

Located on Charlotte Street, behind the New Dawn Centre, the new housing development has been designed by Passive Design Solutions, will be staffed 24-7, and will provide supportive wrap around services like mental health and addictions counselling, connections with treatment and education programs, and harm reduction supplies and practices. Funding for this development has been provided by CMHC through the Cape Breton Regional Municipality.

With funding support from the Government of Canada and Province of Nova Scotia, New Dawn is building a much-needed youth and family centre right in the heart of Glace Bay.

The Glace Bay Youth and Family Centre is a 24,000 square foot facility, to be built on a 6-acre parcel of land on the corner of Reserve and Union streets.

The Centre will provide a vibrant, inclusive, and environmentally sustainable place for families, children, youth, seniors, and community organizations to participate in and deliver a range of programming and activities.

The building is in the design phase, but when it opens in 2026, we expect it to include an indoor gymnasium, childcare centre, indoor skatepark, offices for community organizations, a cafe and commercial kitchen, rentable party rooms, a soft play area for young children, and a range of indoor and outdoor games, amenities, and technologies.


Pine Tree Park Home Living was established by New Dawn in 1991 when it refurbished a number of duplex units, each accommodating three tenants on one side and their care-giving family on the other.

Each Home Living tenant has their own bedroom which they personally furnish and decorate, as well as a shared bathroom, kitchen and living space. The caregiver has both interior and exterior access to the tenant unit and is able to keep constant contact through a monitor.

Referrals for tenants (adults with physical and intellectual disabilities) come to Pine Tree Home Living through the Nova Scotia Department of Community Services.
